<u>UPDATE ON 'ATTEMPTED ABDUC-</u> TION' IN RADCLIFFE

SAFEGUARDING INCIDENT UPDATE

Incidents are now not believed linked and neither are now being treated as attempted child abduction. Detectives investigating two incidents in Bolton and Bury are now treating neither as attempted child abduction.

The first incident took place shortly after 9.40pm on Monday 12 November 2018, when a 14-year-old girl was walking along Lower Southfield towards a ginnel linking to The Pewfist, Westhoughton.

The girl witnessed three people wearing balaclavas jump from a white Transit-style van and run into a nearby housing estate.

Fearing for her safety, she ran to a nearby address and was later safely walked home.

Police are treating the incident as suspicious and are continuing to appeal for information.

In a separate and unconnected incident shortly after 3.40pm on Tuesday 13 November 2018, two 11-year-olds were walking along Spring Lane in Radcliffe when they were engaged in conversation by a man who got out of a white Transit-style van while it was stopped at traffic lights.

On Wednesday 14 November 2018, three men voluntarily attended a police station in relation to the incident in Radcliffe and continue to assist officers with their enquires.



Redvales 3 In Science this week we have been learning about changes between solids and liquids. Rehearsals have begun so prepare to be amazed!






Irwell 1 have been busy reading this week, we have been reading the story "The Snowman's Party" and continuing to read and explore our individual reading books.

We have taken part in different activities during the week including, making traffic light biscuits, role play and drama and some Art work designing road safety posters! We have done some brilliant work!
























