

Whitelow 4 This week Whitelow 4 listened to the poem 'This is my garden' and followed instructions to plant sunflower seeds. We then used soil and leaves with paint to make marks and some of us traced and copied letters and words! In

our cooking session, we made vegetarian noodles and we enjoyed grating carrots and cutting tomatoes and peppers!



Whitelow 5 This week we have made the most of the glorious early spring weather and we went on a walk to feed the ducks. We all had a fantastic time and the ducks had a feast after everybody in Whitelow 5 had finished feeding them. The children remembered all of the safety rules we had spoken about in class and were absolute stars.





**Redvales 1** Welcome back everyone! Redvales 1 have had a lovely week. We enjoyed baking cheese tarts, and we loved our new sensory sto-



ry, "The Christmasaurus". We also enjoyed



designing and making a house for the main character, a snowflake dinosaur.

**Redvales 2** We have had a great week learning through our story Jack and the Beanstalk! We have visited the raised beds and cleared our class section ready to plant our own! We have also been mark-making

Jack and the beanstalk through our write dance sessions.



#### Redvales 3 have

In Maths we have been using our number facts to solve word problems and have been comparing volume and capacity with water. **Redvales 6** have had a wonderful week! Our topic for this half term is "Fee, Fi, Fo, Fum". We loved creating a beanstalk collage after reading the story

#### PROGRESS REPORT FROM PROJECT MANAGER

#### Millwood School- Progress Report No6

- 1.0 Progress Report
- 1.1 Progress to Date

The project commenced on  $7^{th}$  January 2019 and is forecast to complete within a 26 week contract period.

Since the previous report No 5 (12/2/19), the contractor has undertaken the following activities:

- 1. Steel reinforcement for the ground beams and floor slab have further advanced on site.
- 2. Steel superstructure has been erected for the infill classroom.
- 3. The new wall to the corridor has been constructed outside the infill classroom.
- 4. Ground drainage has been reinstated around the extension classroom.

#### 1.2 Progress against Programme

To date the contractor is on programme with their construction activities.

- Piling has been completed.
- Ground beams and floor slab are complete to both classrooms.
- Drainage within the floor slab areas of the extension classroom have been completed.
- The wall in the corridor outside the 'infill' classroom has been completed on the corridor side.

#### 3.0 Project Issues

 The School have reviewed the use of the existing WC room reallocated to the infill classroom and decided that the toilet will not be relocated within the room. This has the effect that the Laundry room will not be subject to works during the Spring break. The WC facility will still close for use by the school from the end of term (29<sup>th</sup> March).



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- 2. Bury MBC and the school have requested an alternative Hoist supplier be approached and this is currently being explored. A meeting has been held on 15<sup>th</sup> February 2019 with a supplier. GN Healthcare & Chameleon Care approached so far. GN Healthcare will attend a meeting with the School on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2019 to discuss hoisting options.
- The extent of fixed furniture is under discussion between Pick Everard and the School. TS Booker are preparing a drawn and costed solution over the next few weeks for review.

#### 4.0 Social Value

The integration between the project and social value matters is being discussed between the contractor and the school. A number of subjects are being discussed in the hope that several opportunities can be incorporated into the project.

The following activities have been completed to date:

1. Ground Breaking Ceremony - successfully took place on 5th February.

The following future activities have been arranged to date:

2. School pupil/Staff presentation by HH Smith – due to take place 1st March.

HH Smith have appointed Diane Whitfield and Chris Purkiss to deal with Social Value matters.

#### 5.0 Environmental

- 1. Materials and equipment from the courtyard are being retained for reuse elsewhere in the school.
- 2. The contractors site compound has been laid out to retain existing trees and avoid any removal.
- 3. The proposed design will use the existing grey water collection system.

#### 6.0 Works planned over next Four weeks

During the next four weeks, during the half term holiday and just after this leading up to the mid-term spring holiday, the following activities are planned to both the infill and extension classrooms:

- Completion of the foundation laying.
- Floor slab installation.
- Completion of the Steel frame superstructure installation.
- External walls and roof commencement.

The following designs will continue:

- Structural foundation design (issued 1st February 2019).
- Steel frame (issued 21st February 2019).
- Architectural (preliminary issued 15th February 2019 and further revisions issued 22nd February 2019).
- Mechanical & Electrical Services including heating, sprinklers, security systems etc.
