A minute's silence was held for all the victims on Monday at 11.00am


FINSBURY PARK ATTACK

Beth Tweddle introduces her programme, Total Gymnastics

PUPILS at a school in Radcliffe were PUPILS at a school in Radcliffe were treated to a session from one of the country's most successful gymnasts. Olympic bronze medallist Beth Weddle visited Millwood Primary Special School as she continues her bid to make gymnastics a mainstay on school curriculum's in the UK. Her dedicated company, Total Gym-nastics, aims to do just this through nervoiding nartnerships with schools

providing partnerships with schools and leisure centres. It's aim is to provide programmes that give teachers valuable experience of working with a qualified coach and pupils the opportunity to receive high level coaching at the same time.

Kety Neild, teacher at the school, said: "Beth was a natural with the chil-dren she met. "She addressed each child at their level and took time to listen to their

questions.

"All the children felt at ease and it was a really enjoyable session for all our pupils."

Millwood, said: "We were honoured to have Beth in school. "She was amazing with the children

and showed them her Olympic medal. "She is simply an inspirational am-bassador for gymnastics and sport." In 2010, Beth was awarded an MBE

for her success, commitment and dedi-

cation to the sport of gymnastics. She represented Great Britain in three Olympic Games in 2004, 2008 and at London 2012 where she won a bronze

medal on the uneven bars. Throughout her career she won gold medals at several World Champion-ships and European Championships.

She also won a gold medal on the une-ven bars at the Commonwealth Games held in Manchester in 2002. On the Total Gymnastics pro-gramme, Beth said: "Gymnastics has been my life and given me so many op-portunities and I want every child to be able to experience gymnastics and have the chance to try something new."
