Redvales 3 this week we have been doing lots of wonderful writing about "The Tale of Peter Rabbit". We have made "Mr McGregor's Garden" in the sensory tray and have enjoyed retelling the story using the puppets. In Maths we have been learning how to use the Numicon to help us to solve number problems and have enjoyed making patterns with the shapes. In Science we have chosen





materials that would make a strong house and we couldn't blow them down! We enjoyed our language group this week where we talked about what makes us happy or sad. In History we were Kings and

Queens for the day and enjoyed a banquet!

Redvales 4 Another busy week! We have been reading "The Three Little Pigs" in English and writing it in our own words or using symbols to retell the story. In Maths we have been practising esti-



mating and using tally charts and bar graphs. We made cups, saucers, jugs and teapots out of paper like the artists Jennifer Collier and Sue Griffiths. In Science we made a fair



test to find out if straw, sticks or bricks were the strongest material to use to build a house. Some of us went swimming and some of us played rugby and in History we compared castles to houses. **Redvales 5** had such an exciting day on Wednesday visiting Manchester Museum. We loved looking at the living things and

amphibians exhibition. We also got to see the skeleton of the T-Rex. We were all so excited.



Redvales 6 have had a super week! We loved our new sensory story "Just like Jasper" which was about a cat spending his birthday money in a toy shop. This led onto mark making using a ball similar to the one in the story. We even baked our own delicious birthday cake! We also

thoroughly enjoyed our session in the light room which involved us activating bub-





ble tubes using switches and focusing our gaze on the moving images of the kaleidoscope.

Irwell 1 have had a lovely week reading the book "Dear Zoo" and putting elephants into size order which was really tricky! We have been learning about static electricity in science and have done some fantastic communication in our morning PECS session.



Irwell 2 We have been learning the days of the week through the story "Mr. Wolf's Week". We tried on lots of clothes to match the weather on different days of the week. **Irwell 3** In Science this week we continued our work looking at magnets. We tested different objects and then used a recording sheet to record whether or not they



were magnetic. Lamia and Henry were making predictions and then testing them to see if they were correct.






If you could see flu germs, you'd see how quickly they spread.
