- Meet regularly over the next few months. At least once every 1-2 weeks, ideally in an evening (but happy to arrange daytime instead, in a child friendly environment for anyone who has babies/toddlers). Be the main point of contact for parents from their school to feedback to.
- Represent for all parents situations, not just their own.
- Help to write surveys to collect data.
- Help to organise drop-ins for parents to view proposals.
- Meet Local Authority representatives to advocate for all their parents in their school.

- Review the current Transport Policy and suggest amendments.





The children have been doing lots of Maths activities about colour; sorting,




naming, saying and reading colour words. We have been retelling the






book this week, "Pass the Jam Jim". We made delicious jam sandwiches and have been learning about big and small.
