Dear Parent / Guardian

Due to unavoidable organisational changes and in order to address new rules regarding consent and also to bring the Schools Orthotic clinic in line with other health related clinics held within Millwood we are introducing a change in how the Orthotic clinic is organised.

From the beginning of the Autumn Term (September 2018), any child who is to be seen in the Orthotic Clinic at Millwood School will need to be accompanied to the appointment by a parent or legal guardian as is normal practice within our hospital based paediatric clinics.

This has the advantage of ensuring the parent/guardian is fully involved in their child's care and allows the Orthotist to fully discuss any proposed Orthotic Treatment directly with the parent / guardian and gain the appropriate consent required for the treatment to proceed.

From September 2018 children whose parent / legal guardian are unable to attend with their child to the appointment will no longer be able to be seen in our school Orthotic clinic and will need to be seen instead in one of the Paediatric clinics held at Fairfield General Hospital, however parental / guardian attendance is also required at these appointments.

We hope you will appreciate that this new arrangement ensures that we can continue to provide an effective and appropriate Orthotic Service to the children who attend Millwood School and ensure that you, as their legal guardian are kept fully informed, and involved with their care.

There will be further information regarding referral into the service, booking of appointments, repairs, collection of goods, shared with you over the next few months. If you have any queries please contact:
