

1.0 Progress Report

1.1 Progress to Date

The project commenced on 7th January 2019 and is forecast to complete within a 26 week contract period.

Since the previous report No 4 (6/2/19), the contractor has undertaken the following activities:


1. Steel reinforcement for the ground beams and floor slab have well advanced on site.

1.2 Progress against Programme

It is early in the project, and to date the contractor is on programme with their construction activities.

Piling has now been completed.




View across the site from the contractors cabin

3.0 Project Issues

- I. The Laundry room will be subject to works during the February half term holidays (previously spring break holiday). Meeting held with the Laundry equipment provider. This will be returned to use by the school by the end of the February half term holiday. Furthermore, the disabled WC located off the swimming baths changing area will close to school use at Spring break (1st April) and remain closed until completion of the adjacent new classroom (approximately 3 months).
- 2. HH Smith have suggested they wish to construct the partition wall off the corridor outside the infill classroom over the February half term holiday. Further discussions are to be held with regard to this and the school informed in advance of the change.
- 3. Bury MBC and the school have requested an alternative Hoist supplier be approached and this is currently being explored (meeting scheduled for 15th February 2019). GN Healthcare & Chameleon Care approached so far.

4.0 Social Value

In the early stages of the project, the potential for integration between the project and social value matters is being discussed between the contractor and the school. A number of subjects are being discussed in the hope that several opportunities can be incorporated into the project.

The following activities have been completed to date:

1. Ground Breaking Ceremony – successfully took place on 5th February.

The following future activities have been arranged to date:

2. School pupil/Staff presentation by HH Smith – due $1^{\rm st}$ March.

HH Smith have appointed Diane Whitfield and Chris Purkiss to deal with Social Value matters.

5.0 Environmental

- Materials and equipment from the courtyard are being retained for reuse elsewhere in the school.
- 2. The contractors site compound has been laid out to retain existing trees and avoid any removal.
- 3. The proposed design will use the existing grey water collection system.

6.0 Works planned over next Four weeks

During the next four weeks, leading up to the mid-term spring holiday, the following activities are planned to both the infill and extension classrooms:

- Foundation laying
- Floor slab installation
- Steel frame installation
- External walls and roof commencement

The following designs will continue:

- Structural foundation design (issued Ist February 2019)
- Steel frame
- Architectural
- Mechanical & Electrical Services including heating, sprinklers, security systems etc.
